

Heritage Satellite Account 2018

- Framework for the analysis of the direct economic impact of cultural heritage (no indirect/induced impact, no ROI)
- Separate from Culture Satellite Account

because natural heritage/cultural activity/heritage-related activities hardly occur in National Accounts

- Economic activities in the value chain model
- Actors: government non-profit profit private persons
- Indicators



ESPON
