The Challenge

- EU policy proposals influence development of regions
- with often territorial effects

ESPON projects

- developed a simplified, evidence-based procedure of an ex ante Territorial Impact Assessment (TIA)

The TIA Quick Check approach

- a “quick and dirty” TIA-check
- combining expert knowledge gathered in a workshop with an Excel tool and standardised indicators
- showing results in maps (NUTS 3 level)

The vulnerability concept

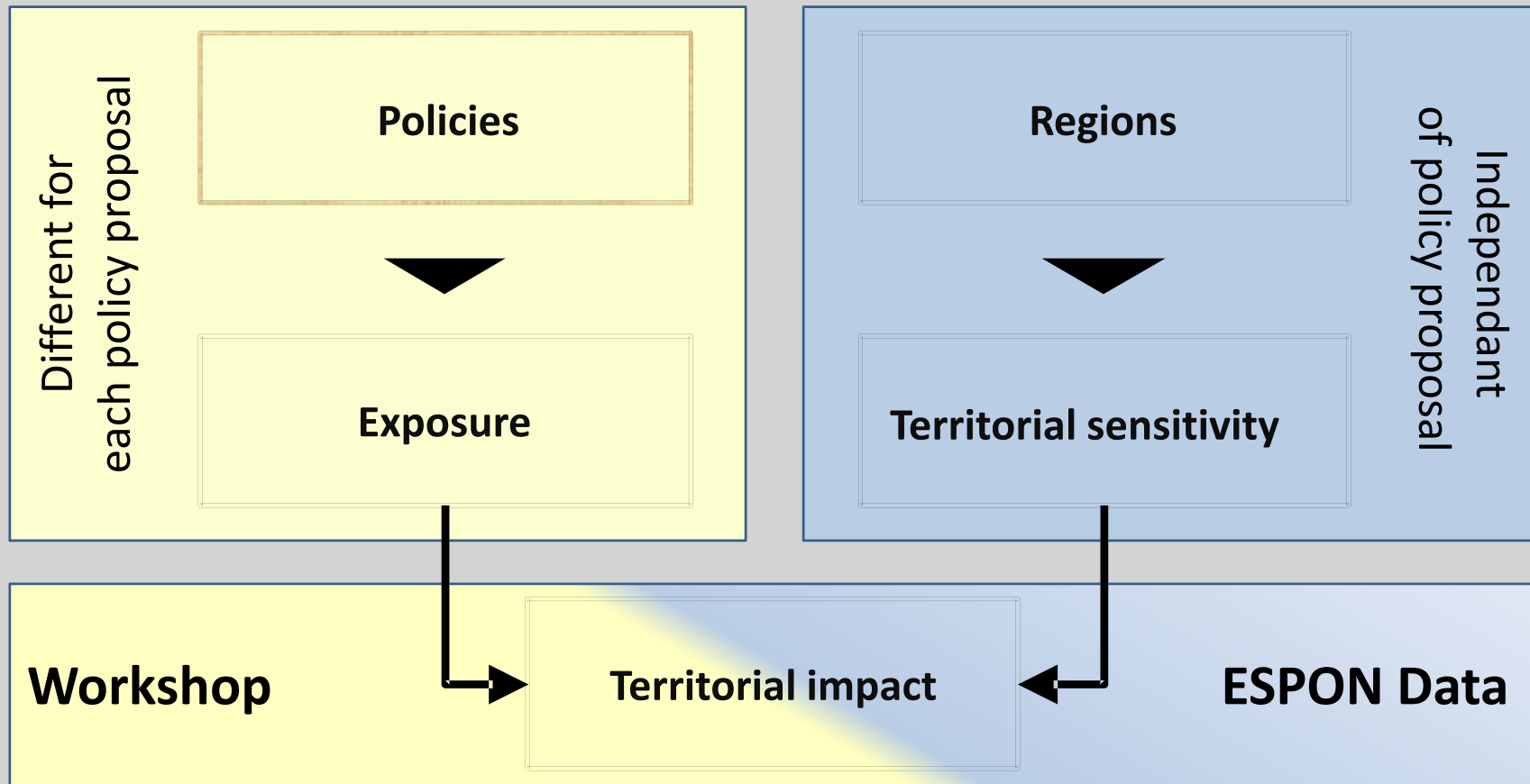
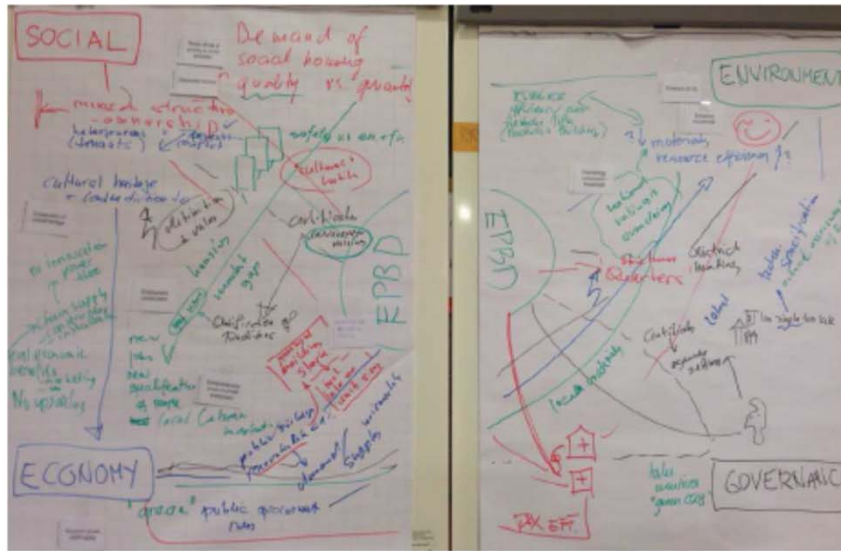


Figure 1: Workshop findings: conceptual model

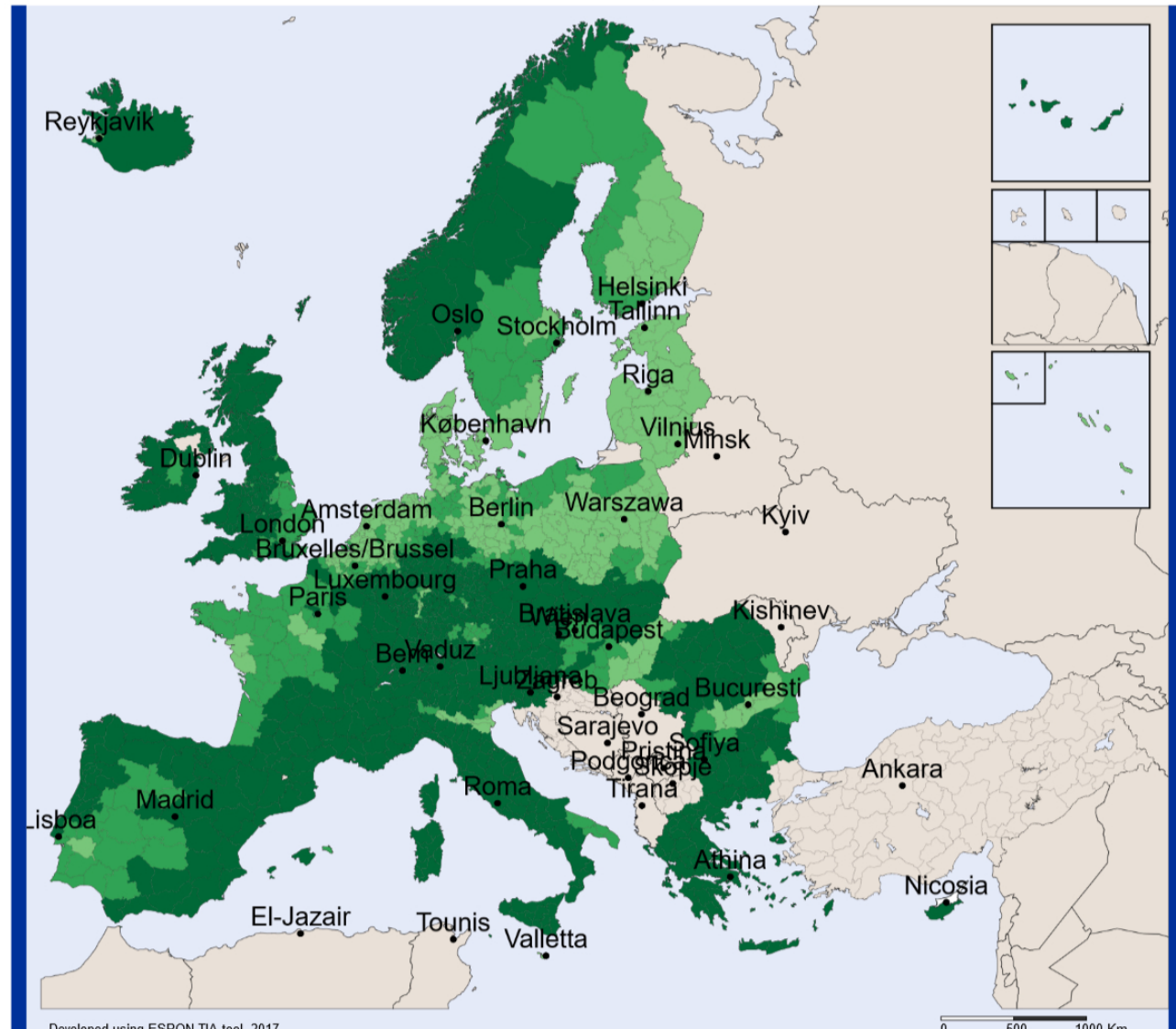
