

### **Policy recommendations**

- Policies directed to SMSTCs should achieve a critical territorial mass sufficient to ensure the effectiveness of local development strategies, enhancing the polycentric structure of territories with lower degree of urbanisation.
- SMSTCs should develop a strong and shared strategic vision, enabling local actors to search for different sources of financial support, without losing the overall direction and the synergy capacity.
- National, regional and local policies should take in consideration SMSTCs within the functional areas of which they are part. They provide a pivotal role for a larger area, and this needs to be taken in to account when addressing local development policies.
