// Context and objectives

The ESPON seminar "State of the European Territory: Digital Innovation Paving the Way for Territorial Cohesion" is organised in cooperation with the Finish Presidency of the EU Council in the framework of the ESPON 2020 Cooperation Programme, which aims to support policy development for promoting territorial cohesion and harmonious development of the European territory.

The aim of the seminar is to provide new insights and discuss ESPON territorial evidence in policy-making by addressing the key topics surrounding the current policy debates and facilitate and support the discussions related to the new Territorial and Urban Agendas as well as post-2020 programming.

The first day will be dedicated to two new ESPON publications: the Report "The State of the European Territory" and the Policy Brief "Digital Innovation in Urban Areas: Solutions for Sustainable and Fluently Working Cities" and networking around ongoing ESPON activities.

- The "State of the European Territory" Report is a milestone publication for ESPON Programme and provides a comprehensive overview of the territorial development trends related to smarter, greener, more connected and more social Europe and bringing Europe closer to its citizens. The report synthesizes key evidence and policy messages coming from the ESPON activities.
- The "Policy Brief Digital Innovation in Urban Environments: Solutions for Sustainable and Fluently Working Cities" stems from the core theme of the Finnish Presidency. It will investigate how human centric innovation will increase quality of life and green development, while also accelerating economic growth.

The second day will build links between Urban Agenda Partnerships and ESPON evidence, focussing on four partnerships: digital transition, energy transition, circular economy and housing. In addition, it will give the participants an overview of future activities of ESPON Programme.

Through different presentations and interactive workshops participants will get an update of the latest ESPON evidence related to the research on digital transformation, circular and collaborative economy, small and medium sized enterprises, green infrastructure and ecosystem services, specific types of territories, urban-rural linkages, energy transition, migration, ageing and housing. In addition, the participants will get an insight to the main messages of the latest ESPON publications and events, tools and maps.

The seminar is aimed at policy makers, stakeholders, practitioners, scientists and experts who are interested in understanding the development challenges and potential of their territory in the context of post-2020 policy framework and programming, Territorial and Urban Agenda, with specific focus on horizontal themes such as governance and digital transformation and how ESPON evidence can support these processes.



// Synthesis Report: State of the European Territory

The EU Cohesion Policy post-2020 debate is ongoing, with Member States and regions preparing their programmatic documents. In order to support programming and planning processes and to emphasize the territorial dimension of Cohesion Policy, the SOET report identifies development challenges and opportunities and examines territorial cooperation needs and potentials.

It offers policy advice to support the design of integrated territorial development strategies and related implementation tools at national, regional and local scale. The policy recommendations presented by the report take account of the European Commission's multiannual financial framework and the related legislative proposals for the post-2020 period.

// Policy Brief:

Digital innovation in urban environments

Cities need the right attitude, knowledge, skills and tools to lay the right foundation for digital transformation. It is important to recognise the culture, processes and structures that support and accelerate innovation. Simple digital improvements applied to existing solutions alone are insufficient, and being creative is often not enough. Moreover, transformation cannot be based on the success of a technology, policy area, agency, department or third-party service provider alone.

Instead, transformation must, in a holistic manner, take into account the interplay of the various challenges and innovation drivers, both horizontally and vertically, at local, regional, national and international levels. Cities must join forces, work together with businesses, academia, civic society and, above all, citizens. The aspirations for digital transition to solve many of the urban challenges should come from the residents and must be echoed in the strategies and carried through procurement and facilitation to allow new digital urban ecosystems to develop and evolve.
